According to Superintendent Ivor Blake, "the training is highly interactive and performance based. Case studies, inter be used to illustrate effective crisis management concepts and principles and participants will be evaluated on their c performance during the exercises."

Blake stated that the basic course may be supplemented with a two-day seminar for selected personnel on the condu

"The first day is expected to focus on exercise development and scenario writing," he said, "while on the second idesigned specifically to test the adequacy of their crisis management plan and reviewing of results, to improve any eff

Upon completion of the training course, trainees must be able to describe the essential components of a crisis mana a crisis management team; describe the essential facilities necessary in support of a planned response to crises and currency in crisis management plans.
